Congratulations on being selected as a finalist! If you are interested in being matched with a mentor who will support you while you draft your full proposal, <u>please fill out this form and return it to bigideas@berkeley.edu by December 21<sup>st</sup>, 2013. (Please note that only one application should be provided by each interested team.) We will match you with a mentor to the best of our ability based on the answers you provide. You will be put in touch with your mentor via e-mail by Tuesday, January 21, 2014.</u>

Please note that we ask mentors to spend a minimum of ten hours total, between January 21<sup>st</sup> and March 11<sup>th</sup> (the Full Proposal deadline), reviewing your pre-proposal and discussing strategies to improve your full proposal. Once you are paired with your mentor, we will provide you with a mentorship agreement contract to help set goals and expectations. However, it will be your responsibility to mutually agree on the number and type of meetings (e.g., phone, Skype, or in-person) that you will have with your mentor.

In thinking about your mentorship needs, note that in the full proposal round of the Big Ideas contest, teams are expected to continue to develop, refine, and expand upon their pre-proposals. Final proposals will be assessed based upon the extent to which, a) the proposal addresses a pressing social, environmental, or campus need, b) the team has thought through all aspects of project implementation, c) the proposal is financial feasible, d) the team is familiar with the market or community they wish to serve, e) the team is composed of members who have the passion and technical capabilities necessary to follow through with their plans, and f) the team has developed a plan to evaluate their project or product.
