- Open to Bay Area based entrepreneurs!

Each session features introductions and office hours hosted by leading Silicon Valley attorneys, entrepreneurs, and venture capitalists. - Open to UC Berkeley students, faculty, and staff!
 UC Berkeley's Crowdfunding Initiative is looking for students who want to use their network to fund their projects! UC Berkeley's Crowdfunding initiative helps students, faculty, staff members, and researchers raise money to turn their great ideas into reality. The next round of crowdfunding will take place October 15 to November 15, 2018 and the deadline to apply is August 23, 2018.
- Open to all young California entrepreneurs! The Westly Foundation is seeking entrepreneurial change makers to apply for the Westly Prize for Young Innovators of California. This awards \$40,000 in cash prizes to innovators under 28 with novel solutions to community challenges at home or around the world. Innovations must be early-stage but prototyped and scalable. The innovators must live, work, or attend school in California, or have a residence in California but attend school elsewhere. Individual founders or founding teams of up to four may apply. Non-profit, for-profit, or hybrid ventures are eligible, if they demonstrate a strong social mission. Learn more here, and apply here! The deadline to apply is October 15, 2018.

 The Big PITCH competition awards \$10,000 to student innovators in the field of sustainability. BIG Pitch is part of Ocean Exchange, a non-profit with the sole mission to help advance sustainable solutions from early stage companies, either for-profit or not-for-profit. BIG Pitch evaluates enterprises based on impact, level of innovation, and the ability to execute/implement/commercialize. To be eligible, the team must be compromised mostly of undergraduate or graduate level students with solutions that support sustainability. The deadline to apply is September 7 2018 at 11:59pm GMT (+\$50 registration fee).
