### Big Ideas Abroad: Supporting Student Innovation in Uganda

Since 2013, the Big Ideas Contest has been open to <u>Makerere University</u>, Uganda's largest post-secondary school and leader in innovation and research. Makerere students' participation in Big Ideas has since risen dramatically: the university now accounts for the highest representation of Big Ideas preproposal submissions from any school outside of UC Berkeley. # **Grants, Prizes & Challenges**

#### MIT Clean Energy Prize - New Developing Economies Track

The MIT Clean Energy Prize is a multi-stage, student-organized business plan competition. In 2016, student entrepreneurial teams competed for a \$100,000 Grand Prize and \$125,000 in category prizes, among other awards. Student teams enter their business ideas in one of four categories: Generating Energy, Delivering Energy, Improving Energy Usage, and Energy for Developing Economies. #### **DIL Explorer Travel Grant**

<u>The Development Impact Lab (DIL)</u> at UC Berkeley invites eligible researchers and graduate students to apply for the Spring 2017 DIL Explore Travel Grant competition (up to US \$5,000 in direct costs). The grant supports a) early-stage exploratory research that combines technology innovation with social and economic research to solve international

development challenges (i.e. the emerging field of development engineering); or b) travel to developing countries that supports development engineering projects through research, fact-finding or new partnerships. The Bay Area Global Health Innovation Challenge will be held on May 20-21, 2017 in San Francisco, California. An annual competition hosted by the University of California, Berkeley, Stanford University, and the HealthRoots Foundation for Global Health, it offers student teams from universities worldwide the opportunity to present ideas for low-cost, high-impact, scalable global health innovations. Teams will compete for the grand prize of \$10,000 in seed funding, and will have the opportunity to engage a high-level cohort of judges and speakers.
