#### Women4Climate Tech Challenge

C40 and Autodesk launched the <u>Women4Climate Tech Challenge</u>, a global competition designed to spark innovation and accelerate climate solutions from women in the tech community. Projects must be women-led and may address a wide range of urban sustainability issues, such as mobility, food, waste, water, buildings, urban farming, and air quality. **Applications are due by 30 November 2018.**

#### **Development Innovation Ventures (DIV)**

USAID's program - <u>Development Innovation Ventures (DIV)</u> - is accepting applications that test ideas and scale proven solutions for global development challenges. DIV provides tiered grant funding (\$50,000 to \$5,000,000) for innovative solutions that demonstrate rigorous evidence of impact, cost-effectiveness, and a viable pathway to scale.
