Stop Girl Trafficking: A Discussion with Dr. Aruna Uprety

Wednesday, April 13, 5:00pm B100 Blum Hall, UC Berkeley

Dr. Aruna Uprety, prominent activist and advocate for women's rights and education in Nepal, heads Project: Stop Girl Trafficking.

When Aruna traveled to Mumbai and saw firsthand the horrors that await the thousands of young girls sold or lured by traffickers each year, she made it her life's work to protect and empower Nepal's most vulnerable girls. She began a partnership with the American Himalayan Foundation to transform countertrafficking by combining two powerful insights: that preventing girls from being trafficked was more effective than rescuing them, and that education was the best prevention tool. The 18 year partnership has grown from 52 girls in one district to 14,800 girls in 519 schools across Nepal. And each year, hundreds of them graduate as educated, confident young women.
