Jeremy Fiance was <u>acknowledged in Forbes' Education</u> <u>category</u> for his work launching <u>The House Fund</u>, a preseed and seed stage venture capital fund investing in Berkeley's top students, faculty, and alumni startups. Jeremy won Big Ideas in 2012-2013 for his Free Ventures project (Improving Student Life), and in 2013-2014 for his Dropsense project (IT for Society).

<u>Ava</u> founders Thibault Duchemin, Pieter Doevendans, and Skinner Cheng were <u>acknowledged in Forbes' Consumer</u> <u>Technology category</u> for their work developing a mobile tool to convert conversations into text for hearing-impaired individuals. ## **DIL Explorer Travel Grant**

<u>The Development Impact Lab (DIL)</u> at UC Berkeley invites eligible researchers and graduate students to apply for the Spring 2017 DIL Explore Travel Grant competition (up to US \$5,000 in direct costs). The grant supports a) early-stage exploratory research that combines technology innovation with social and economic research to solve international development challenges (i.e. the emerging field of development engineering); or b) travel to developing countries that supports development engineering projects through research, fact-finding or new partnerships. ## Bay Area Global Health Innovation Challenge

The Bay Area Global Health Innovation Challenge will be held on May 20-21, 2017 in San Francisco, California. An annual competition hosted by the University of California, Berkeley, Stanford University, and the HealthRoots Foundation for Global Health, it offers student teams from universities worldwide the opportunity to present ideas for low-cost, high-impact, scalable global health innovations. Teams will compete for the grand prize of \$10,000 in seed funding, and will have the opportunity to engage a high-level cohort of judges and speakers. ## Pear VC \$250K Entrepreneurship Challenge for UC Berkeley

The winning team will receive up to \$250,000 in seed funding, become part of the community, and have access to networks, resources, and a "hacker studio" in downtown Palo Alto. Pear will invest up to \$250k in the company via equity seed financing for 5% and designate 10% of our ownership back to UC Berkeley. Winning companies will have the chance to work very closely with the Pear investment team.
